- Use Naviance to research and start developing your college list
- Make an appointment with your counselor to discuss your plans

Senior Year

- College Planning Presentation for Families and classroom lesson on post-graduate planning
- Finalize your college list add schools to Naviance and link it to Common App
- Begin to fill out the Common Application or specific school applications
- Review your transcript with your counselor
- Write your college essay
- Ask your teacher(s) and counselor for a letter of recommendation
- Meet with your counselor early and often
- Pay attention to deadlines
- Fill out the FAFSA application and/or CCS profile opens October 1st

- Colleges are flexible with grades Understand pass/fail or credit/no credit grades for spring of 2020 and will not be held against students
- Many colleges are offering virtual visits, open houses and tours
- Guidance offers virtual college visits to seniors through Naviance
- Many college fairs are virtual through NACAC & College Board
- New Common App Covid optional essay prompt Community disruptions such as
 COVID-19 and natural disasters can have deep and long-lasting impacts. If you need
 it, this space is yours to describe those impacts. Colleges care about the effects on
 your health and well-being, safety, family circumstances, future plans, and
 education, including access to reliable technology and quiet study spaces.

What has changed with SAT and ACT in Admissions?

- Many colleges were test-optional for the 2021- 22 applications which means that students can choose to apply without submitting test scores for SY; some have chosen to remain test optional
- Website to find out which schools are test optional: <u>www.fairtest.org</u>
- Make sure to check requirements for each school, as some schools may have other requirements
- SAT is no longer offering SAT Subject tests
- SAT will discontinue the optional SAT Essay after the June 2021 administration
