

## Course Levels



- Advanced (A): Students should anticipate intense pacing and collegiate analysis of the curriculum. Students should be accomplished independent learners who are highly self-motivated and can manage rigorous homework expectations. Summer work may be required.
- Honors (H): Students should anticipate fast pacing and deep analysis of the curriculum. Students should be self-motivated to manage more rigorous homework expectations.
- College and Career Preparatory (CCP): Students should anticipate moderate pacing and deep exploration of the curriculum in CCP level classes. Students should be motivated to engage with a workload that prepares them for post-secondary education and/or careers.



- Students must take 5 academic courses (English, Math, Science, Social Studies and Foreign Language) plus one elective for 5 credits or two electives for 2.5 credits each
- Students should choose an ALTERNATE to their primary ELECTIVE request
- Students need to select at least six 5 credit courses for a full schedule

### Course Selection Process




- Your teachers recommend the courses they feel are most appropriate for you based on your grades and performance in each subject area.
- Each student will log onto Aspen to see their course recommendations.
- Students will need to choose their elective class.
- Parents/guardians approve recommendations and requests on Aspen by March 26th.
- If you have any questions about your recommendations please see your School Counselor.

### Course Selection Information


- Students who would like to take a course not recommended by a teacher should type a note to their counselor in the "note to counselor" box.
- Counselors will review all course requests and set up meetings with students throughout the spring however students are encouraged to sign up to meet with their counselor if they have an immediate question or concern.
- ▶ If you have not selected enough courses to satisfy requirements for your academic track, the system lets you know which area you need to make more requests in. Please verify that you have 31 credits.
- We build the entire schedule and assign faculty based on information we receive from March course selection. Requests for changes, after that time, will only be honored after careful consideration.
- We cannot stress enough importance of carefully considering and selecting courses in the spring.


- After logging into the Student Portal choose My Info top tab -Requests side tab



- PE is an automatic addition of 1.0 credit.






